Covid 19 Updates

There have been several updates this week through Compass on the tighter restrictions that have been put in place. General guidelines around sickness have also been tightened. Below are the guidelines around sickness and respiratory symptoms from the government.

NATIONAL SCIENCE WEEK

National Science Week is Australia's annual celebration of science and technology. We believe that this year, more than any other, it is important to recognise the work done on our behalf by scientists, medical researchers, and health professionals, as well as the meteorologists, bushfire propagation mathematicians and others who helped the fire fighting authorities to combat the recent devastating bushfires.

The new Science and Technology Syllabus states:

Through studying Science and Technology students explore scientific and technological concepts and gain knowledge and understanding of the world. They develop skills in conducting scientific investigations and designing and producing solutions through learning about the Living World, Material World, Physical World, Earth and Space, and Digital Technologies.



WHY IS IT IMPORTANT TO STUDY SCIENCE?

• The scientific method fosters thinking skills- It's where you start with an idea, create a concrete way to prove or disprove your idea, and objectively show what you learned.

• Science feeds a natural love for learning- Children are inquisitive explorers by nature and science offers lots to explore. Because much of science is hands-on, it appeals readily to most children.

• **Science opens doors to many disciplines**- Building an aptitude for science can be helpful in other areas of study.

• Science prepares for the future- As we prepare the next generation of consumers, voters, creators, and policy makers it is critical to ensure they are not only comfortable but adept in science.

From the classroom (Year 3)

Year 3 have been learning about solids, liquids and gases, their properties and how these materials react when heated and cooled.

This week they have investigated materials through an iPad microscope and were amazed at what they saw.

They also predicted and investigated how long it takes for different sizes of ice to melt. Some of the ice took all day to melt!
