Thank you for completing the survey sent out by the Diocese just before the holidays. I am expecting the results early next week and will be considering the data as I plan strategically for our 5 year School Improvement Plan. Parent voice is essential to our plans, so thank you for responding.

Uniform Additions

Our uniform offering is set to have some additions, thanks to the survey which asked about preferences for summer shorts and blouses for the girls. Respondents opted strongly in favour of the box pleat short and the blouse with red piping. The uniform shop is now organising supplies, but with the pandemic, lead times are lengthy. Thank you for your patience.

Year 5 Leadership Day

This term is an important one to Year 5 as they prepare for their leadership roles next year. Unfortunately their traditional leadership camp had to be cancelled due to the pandemic. I was keen however, that they are nurtured and developed into their roles and so have arranged for 'Youthworks Christian Outdoor Education' to visit for the day (17th November). The day will be full of fun leadership tasks, team building activities and reflections on how we can each make positive contributions to various situations. I hope they enjoy the day but also find it of great value as they begin to prepare for leadership.

St Leo's Priority Feeder School

We launched our priority feeder school project with St Leo's College in the last week of term 3. I have had many positive comments about the project and am due to meet with Mr Anthony Gleeson next week regarding projects to link our two schools. Projects may include science links, creative arts and or leadership mentoring.

It is a positive advantage that should a student wish to attend St Leo's, the process will ensure no additional application form or fee. The 'Compass' team at CSBB is working on ways to transfer all the data seamlessly without the extra paperwork and so hopefully removing any stress for parents.

STANDARDISED TESTING

Early in Term 4 during the first weeks, all students from Year 2 -6 will be involved in PAT Standardised Assessments for Maths and Reading to gather further data about your child and enable future planning and direction. The data is informative for teachers to get additional glimpses of your child's strengths and needs to cater for their learning. It is important to remember that these tests are a small snapshot of the abilities of your child and need to be balanced against their everyday class work and achievements. Some students find standardised testing stressful, while others thrive in this style of assessment. NAPLAN is another standardised Test that normally occurs In Years 3 and 5 but was cancelled for the 2020 year due to COVID.

What is PAT?

Progressive Achievement Tests (PAT) are a series of tests designed to provide objective, norm-referenced information to teachers about their students' skills and understandings in a range of key areas.

Definition of a standardised test:

"A standardised test is any form of test that (1) requires all test takers to answer the same questions, or a selection of questions from a common bank of questions, in the same way, and that (2) is scored in a "standard" or consistent manner, which makes it possible to compare the relative performance of individual students or groups of students."

Why do we use PAT?

ACER's Progressive Achievement Tests are used in thousands of schools in Australia and around the world. The approach focuses on assessing and monitoring student growth over time and is underpinned by an understanding that students of the same age and in the same year of school can be at very different points in their learning and development.

What impact does PAT have on teaching and learning?

In adopting and using Progressive Achievement Tests for Maths and English we can investigate and diagnose student learning and monitor progress over time. Teachers are working within a growth mindset, with the benefits of targeted teaching, increased levels of student engagement and improved learning outcomes.




