St Bernard's Church 50th Anniversary Celebrations



Candela Talk by Mary Rajca

Mrs Mary Rajca will visit our school on Monday December 7th to speak to the children about the work of the Sisters of Mercy in the shanty town of Candela in Lima Peru.

The mission supports women through a programme that teaches them to make beautiful handicrafts. The proceeds from the sale of these crafts give the women an income so they can provide for their families. All money raised goes back to the women who have made the goods. This money is used by the mothers to buy basic necessities for their families.

The Pandemic has struck the shanty towns in Peru very badly. All shops and factories are shut – most people are out of work and there is no support from the government. The women in Candela are living off their meagre savings and from the generous support of donors in Sydney.

During the week of December 7th the children will have the opportunity to buy a beautifully made item from Candela. This is the women's only source of income and this year the women have found it especially difficult to care for their families.

DEVELOPING GREAT LEADERS

Year 5 have recently concluded nominations and are presently involved in preparing their speeches and profiles for 2021 leadership positions. At St Bernard's, not only do we nominate and vote for School, Vice and Sport Captains but we also have various leadership teams so that all students in the grade have the opportunity to develop the skills required to lead in an area of interest or personal strength.

Leadership is a practical and valuable skill that can help your child go far later in life. All students have the potential to lead and develop the necessary skills. The following parent tips can be used to support your child in developing the skills required:



Good Leaders are Good Communicators

This doesn't mean they only talk; good leaders also listen.

Provide them with opportunities – engage in conversation, be open to sharing about feelings, share books and discuss the stories, explore and discover together.

Adopt a Positive Belief

Leadership means adopting a "yes, I can!" approach. Provide opportunities for your child to try things for themself; to experience an appropriate level of challenge and to receive positive feedback for his/her effort. Present activities where they are encouraged to make choices, given challenges or opportunities to explore and discover. These activities encourage active participation in learning, provide opportunities for positive encouragement, and contribute to the "I can" belief.

Show Resilience

Overcoming challenges, being able to "bounce back" from disappointment and being open to trying a different approach are important areas that leaders should develop.

Modelling how you fix mistakes (and the fact that you make them), acknowledging feelings, encouraging your child to ask questions and asking him/her to think and express his/ her ideas are good ways you can work on enabling this.

Have a sense of Responsibility

Being committed to something and taking ownership are qualities of a leader. Give him/her simple things to do, for example, helping with some of the household chores, tidying up toys, helping to water the plants, and so on.

Whether or not he/she becomes a great leader, helping your little one develop the areas mentioned above is important to help him/her fulfil their potential.

As dancer and artist Stacia Tauscher put it:

"We worry about what a child will become tomorrow, yet we forget that he is someone today."

BYODD - Bring Your Own Designated Device


for 2021

All St Bernard's families with children in Years 1-6 have been emailed the updated Parent Information Booklet for BYODD that has details on the device, school procedures and expectations in regard to our BYODD program and to help families make an informed decision on the use of personal devices. A special reminder that this initiative is optional and for Years 2-6 only. Any new iPads purchased over the holidays can be brought in any day from **Thursday 4th February** for school wifi connection. You may also decide to wait until a birthday or an alternative time during the year to purchase an iPad for your child. If you choose to purchase an iPad some other time during 2021, you just need to let your class teacher know a few days before so that we can organise connection to the school wifi.

PLEASE NOTE:

If purchasing a new iPad, the current version is the one you would buy for use at school for 2021, which is the iPad 8th Generation (not mini, air or pro). The information booklet specifies that the **minimum** specification that CSBB can connect to wifi is the 7th Generation iPad - wifi only (minimum 32GB). This means that if your child has been using an iPad Gen 7 this year, the device will continue to be supported in 2021. This is the **minimum** requirement.

What's been happening in the learning hub?



From the classroom (Japanese—Alison McNeill)

Minasan konnichiwa – Hello (good afternoon) everyone.

I wanted to let you all know what your wonderful children have been doing this year in Japanese. I am so proud of the learning they have done, even with the challenges that this year has thrown at us all.

Kindergarten have been learning about Japan, festivals and folk tales, how to talk about the weather and this term has been all about zoo animals.

Stage 1 have been studying schools in Japan, classroom objects, all about 'my family' as well as lots of paper craft. This week they even recorded themselves doing a little speech in Japanese about a family from their "Little House" books.

Stage 2 were supposed to be following the Tokyo 2020 Olympic Games. They still learnt about sports, clubs and hobbies, looked at schools and had a mini Undoukai (Sports Day). There was also lots of origami and even 'Interviews with an Olympic Athlete' – all in Japanese.

Stage 3 also studied and participated in the 'Interviews with an Olympic Athlete' as part of HBL. The main focus this year was learning about restaurants and food in Japan, shops and money (yen). All this knowledge will allow the students to go shopping using full Japanese and paying with yen which is happening next week as a role play in the classroom. The students have been working very hard on this.

I have really enjoyed teaching the students at St Bernard's this year and am looking forward to next year when we learn about farms and pets (Stage 1), All About Me (Stage 2) and travel around Japan (Stage 3).




